Black Hawk Folk Society Shifts Winter Programming: Holiday Potluck & Open Mic to Replace December Concert

Black Hawk Folk Society's Council has decided to change our winter programming, discontinuing online concert offerings during the colder months. After several years of bringing music to audiences virtually, we have decided to focus our energy on in-person community events when possible. The decision reflects a broader shift back toward live gatherings, as audiences and performers alike express a growing desire for face-to-face connection and shared musical experiences.

In place of the traditional Second Saturday concert in December, BHFS will host a festive Holiday Potluck and Open Mic! The event is scheduled for

the <u>first</u> Saturday – December 6 - at Mountain View Community Center, providing a familiar setting with a fresh twist. A potluck lunch at noon will be followed by the open mic sign up by emailing Tom at tomstraydog@aim.com.

Members, friends, and local musicians are invited to share songs, poems, and stories in a relaxed, welcoming environment that captures the spirit of the season.

This change offers a new opportunity for local talent to shine and for community members to come together in celebration. Whether you're a seasoned performer or simply want to enjoy an afternoon of holiday cheer and spontaneous creativity, the Black Hawk Folk Society's holiday open mic promises an afternoon of warmth and camaraderie.


